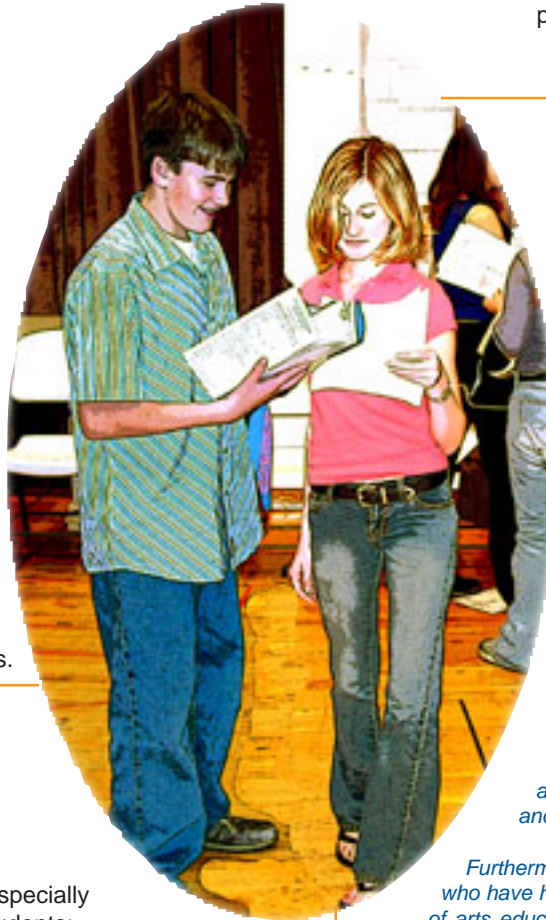

Elements of Acting

Grades 9 – 12

High school students can hone their acting skills through monologues, improvisational exercises, and concentrated scene study customized to the abilities and interest levels of the registrants.

Grades 6 – 8

An introduction to the basics especially designed for middle school students: warm-up routines, improvisational games, movement and vocal exercises. Explore character and scene development through dialogue and pantomime. The course can be taken more than once as curriculum content varies each term.

An introduction to the basics of lighting, scene painting techniques, set design, makeup, and stage combat! Enroll early since class size is limited to 10 students!

Research has shown that arts education encourages high achievement; builds creative problem-solving, teamwork, leadership, and analytical skills; and refines judgment.

Furthermore, students who have had four years of arts education score an average of 59 points higher on the verbal portion and 44 points higher on the math portion of the SAT.

Camp Shakespeare

Designed for students who have completed grades 4 – 6, Camp Shakespeare is ASF's week-long summer day camp. Classes, which meet from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., introduce students to the following five areas of the performing arts, culminating in a student performance on an ASF stage of an abridged production of *Macbeth*. Teamwork and an appreciation for Shakespearean language grow naturally out of this program, which sells out early every year. Don't wait until spring to enroll!

Theatre Orientation

Theatre games, improvisational exercises, stage terminology, theatre history, stage combat, and more.

Acting

Practical experience in acting, using text to determine character and movement.

Technical Theatre

How a theatre "works," from costumes and makeup to lights and scenery.

Vocal Performance

All actors are encouraged to sing, and this class, within a group setting, will help students learn how to project and control their voices.

Movement

A variety of styles, from classic ballet to jazz dance will be explored.
